LIMS annual prize for the best interdisciplinary essay in memory studies

The LIMS – Interdepartmental Lab Memory and Society, based at the **Department of Humanities** and the **Department of Sociology** of the University of Trento, has established a new prize for early career scholars.

In tune with the interdisciplinary approach which is constitutive of memory studies as a field, which is strongly endorsed and cultivated at LIMS in Trento, the prize will prioritize essays which focus on memory issues and employ a **clear interdisciplinary 'toolkit'** in order to achieve their scientific goals.

1. Requirements

The call is reserved to **non-tenured memory scholars** from any disciplinary background, with no age criterion applied. MA laureates and PhD students are also eligible applicants.

Only **unpublished essay, in English**, will be considered, with a maximum length of **10,000 words, including references**.

2. Evaluation criteria

Proposed essays will be evaluated according to the following criteria:

- **originality** of the contribution to the field of memory studies
- **methodological consistency** and creativity
- effective and **innovative use of an interdisciplinary interpretive toolkit**

3. Application procedure

Applications will be collected via an online application platform, available at ([link](#)). This is a recurring call: the deadline is **Aug. 1** every year.

- Unpublished essay, in English, with a maximum length of 10,000 words, including references
- Copy of identity card or passport
- Telephone number and email address
- Copy of this call signed for acceptance
- Curriculum vitae

4. Jury and evaluation procedure

The evaluation committee includes **Giorgia Proietti, Giuseppe Sciortino, Thomas Van de Putte**. One or two external reviewers will be recruited depending on the subjects of the essays received.



5. Results and award

The winner will be invited to deliver (online) the opening lecture of every year's LIMS seminar series in early spring.

The winner will be awarded a money prize (300,00 euros); the prize is subject to a 25% withholding tax.

The results will be transmitted via email to all applicants by Oct. 1.

Honorable mentions and additional invitations for online lectures are possible for a maximum of two other essays.

6. Processing of personal data

Pursuant to Article 13 of EU Regulation 2016/679 "General Regulation on the Protection of Personal Data" (GDPR), the University of Trento will process personal data for its institutional purposes exclusively for the conduct of this selection procedure (Article 6, paragraph 1, letter e), of the GDPR).

The processing of personal data will be carried out in a paper and/or computerized manner exclusively by personnel authorized to process the data in relation to the assigned tasks and duties and in compliance with the principles of lawfulness, correctness, transparency, adequacy, relevance and necessity.

The data collected will not be transferred to non-EU countries. The provision of personal data is essential for the conduct of this procedure and failure to provide it precludes participation in the procedure itself.

The data will be kept for the period necessary to carry out the procedure and to carry out all legal requirements. In any case, they will be kept for the time established by current legislation and/or University regulations regarding the management and preservation of documentation produced by the University in carrying out its institutional activity.

At any time, the rights referred to in Articles 15 et seq. of the GDPR may be exercised against the Data Controller, and in particular, access to their personal data, rectification, integration, deletion, limitation, and the right to object to processing. The right to lodge a complaint with the Data Protection Supervisor pursuant to Article 77 of the GDPR remains intact.
