



**SELECTION NOTICE FOR THE AWARD OF
5 PLACES FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE
EXCAPE INTERNATIONAL SUMMER SCHOOL**

The Director of the Department of Psychology and Cognitive Science

Given that the Erasmus+ project *eXcape – XR Escape Room: Soft Skills Training for the Modern Learner* is organizing an International Summer School from September 7 to 9 at the Sarajevo School of Science and Technology.

Given that the participation of students from the universities of the project consortium is expected.

Art. 1 – Description and Recipients

A evaluation procedure based on qualifications is announced at the Department of Psychology and Cognitive Science of the University of Trento for the assignment of a maximum of 5 places reserved for students enrolled at the University of Trento to participate in the eXcape Summer School from September 7 to 9 at the Sarajevo School of Science and Technology (Bosnia). The 5 positions will all be covered by a scholarship. The amount of each scholarship, as provided for by the project agreements, will be 750 euro, intended to cover travel, board, and lodging costs at the Summer School venue. Any excess expenses will be borne by the selected students.

Art. 2 – Requirements for Participation in the Selection

The selection is open to candidates, Italian or foreign, enrolled at the University of Trento in a bachelor's (triennale) or master's (magistrale) degree course, who possess a level of English language proficiency equal to at least B2.

Art. 3 – Submission of the Application for Admission

The application for participation in the eXcape Summer School must be submitted exclusively using the online compilation and submission method provided for this purpose, by accessing the page: https://webapps.unitn.it/Apply/it/Web/GoHome/stp/EISS_26 **no later than 11:59 PM on July 22, 2026**, using the University credentials or SPID (Public Digital Identity System). In the application, the candidate must declare under their own responsibility:

- their first name and surname (as reported in the attached identity document), date and place of birth, citizenship, residence, domicile chosen for the purposes of the evaluation, and the e-mail address at which to receive communications relating to the selection procedure;
- that they possess the requirement indicated in Art. 2 of the call;



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- that they undertake to promptly communicate any change in their residence, chosen domicile, and/or contact details indicated in the application for admission.

The Administration assumes no responsibility in the event of loss of communications resulting from inaccurate indications by the applicant or from failure or late communication of changes in contact details, nor for any postal or electronic malfunctions.

Candidates must attach to the application:

- a) the curriculum vitae in PDF format;
- b) the list of exams passed and the study plan (piano di studi);
- c) a motivational letter including academic interest in the theme of soft skills development;
- d) English language certification of a minimum B2 level with reference to the Common European Framework – CEFR (certificate of English language knowledge issued by an internationally recognized certifying body, referring for duration and type of certification to the indications and table available on the University Language Centre - CLA website; or an exam certificate attesting the passing of a general university English language exam of B2 level—the B2 level must appear in the name of the exam; or a certificate of passing a course of a minimum B2 level at the CLA).

The University assumes no responsibility for cases where the recipient is untraceable and for loss of communications depending on inaccurate indications of contact details by the candidate or from failure or late communication of the change of address indicated in the application. Furthermore, the university administration assumes no responsibility for cases of non-delivery or late delivery of the application, qualifications, or communications relating to the selection, due to postal or telegraphic malfunctions, third-party acts, fortuitous events, or force majeure.

Art. 4 – Evaluation and Ranking Formulation

A committee, appointed by the Director of DIPSCO, will evaluate the candidates' applications. The evaluation will take into consideration skills and interests regarding the themes of the school. The Committee may utilize electronic tools for collective work throughout all phases of the evaluation procedure.

The Evaluation Committee draws up minutes of the operations carried out in the evaluation procedure. The Committee draws up a final merit ranking at the conclusion of the qualification evaluation phase. In the event of a tie in the score, preference is given to the younger candidate pursuant to Law 127/1997 (Art. 3, paragraph 7). The selection procedure concludes with the formulation of the final merit ranking. Candidates successfully placed in the ranking will receive written communication of their participation in the Summer School by **July 24, 2026**.

Art. 5 – Acceptance of Financial Benefits

The disbursement of the contribution will be conditional upon the actual acceptance of the place at the eXcape Summer School and the complete filling out of the accounting documentation for the scholarship. To accept the contribution, the candidate will receive specific documentation at the email address indicated during the selection phase, stating the date by which they must accept



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participation in the Summer School, the acceptance of the scholarship, and the concurrent commitment to return it in full in case of non-participation, in whole or in part, in the initiative.

Art. 6 – Disbursement of the Scholarship

The scholarship will be paid exclusively by credit to a bank or postal current account, held or co-held by the student.

Art. 7 – Revocation of Benefits

The scholarship will be revoked in the event of withdrawal from attendance or interruption of attendance before the end of the eXcape Summer School. In case of revocation of the scholarship, the sums received must be returned in full to the University of Trento through the PagoPA system following receipt of a specific IUV notice (Art. 5 of Legislative Decree no. 82 of March 7, 2005 - Digital Administration Code and Art. 65, paragraph 2 of Legislative Decree no. 217 of December 13, 2017).

Art. 8 – Information Notice on the Processing of Personal Data Carried Out within Competitive and Selection Procedures

The EU Regulation 2016/679 "General Data Protection Regulation" (hereinafter "GDPR") establishes the right of every person to the protection of personal data concerning them. Pursuant to Articles 13 and 14 of EU Regulation 2016/679, the University of Trento intends to provide participants in competitive/selection procedures issued by the University (hereinafter "data subjects") with the following information. Specifically, all calls for applications aimed at hiring technical-administrative staff, professors, and researchers, both fixed-term and permanent, selections for adjunct professors, research fellows, scholarship holders, and collaborators in various capacities are included.

Purposes of Processing and Legal Basis

The University of Trento processes personal data, including special and judicial data, within the scope of performing its tasks of public interest as well as for compliance with legal obligations exclusively for the following purposes: management of competitive/selection procedures (Art. 6, par. 1, lett. e) GDPR); provision of aids and additional time for conducting tests (Art. 9, par. 2, lett. g) GDPR); checks on the veracity of self-certifications rendered pursuant to Presidential Decree 445/2000 (Art. 6, par. 1, lett. c) and Art. 10 GDPR); completing the procedure, with relevant mandatory communications; establishing, exercising, or defending a right in judicial proceedings (Art. 9, par. 2, lett. f) GDPR; Articles 6, par. 1, lett. e) and 10 GDPR).

Category of Data Processed



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Personal data: first name and surname, date and place of birth, tax code (codice fiscale), nationality and citizenship, municipality of enrollment in the electoral lists, contact details (telephone number, residence and/or domicile addresses, email address); educational qualifications, data suitable for detecting knowledge, capacities, skills, and competences in the educational and professional fields; special categories of data: data relating to one's own health and/or that of family members, also inferable from any preference qualifications; judicial data: criminal convictions and offenses.

Source of Data

Personal data are collected both from the data subjects and from other sources, such as public administrations and judicial records.

Nature of Data Provision

The provision of personal data is essential for participation in competitive/selection procedures, and failure to provide them precludes participation. The provision of personal data to benefit from aids and additional time during the tests is optional, and failure to provide them makes it impossible for the Administration to guarantee the same.

Processing Methods

The processing of personal data is carried out using paper, computerized, and/or telematics methods by personnel authorized to process data in relation to the tasks and duties assigned and in compliance with the principles of lawfulness, fairness, transparency, adequacy, relevance, data minimization, and confidentiality (Art. 5, par. 1, GDPR). No profiling or automated decisions are carried out.

Categories of Recipients

The data will be communicated, in addition to the staff of the University structures involved in achieving the aforementioned purpose, to other public and private entities for the purposes indicated above. Entities that, within the scope of supplying services necessary for the pursuit of the aforementioned purposes, process personal data of data subjects on behalf of the University will be designated as Data Processors pursuant to Art. 28 GDPR. Outside of these cases, personal data may be communicated to third parties only in the event of compliance with a legal obligation and/or an order of the Judicial Authority. Some personal data may be subject to publication in the appropriate section of the University portal in compliance with the obligations provided for by current legislation. If, within the scope of the aforementioned purposes, personal data are transferred to non-EU countries, the transfer of such data will be carried out within the limits and under the conditions of Articles 44 et seq. of the GDPR, i.e., in the presence of an adequacy decision by the European Commission and, in its absence, appropriate safeguards.

Data Retention Period

Personal data will be kept for the period necessary to achieve the aforementioned purpose and in any case for the time necessary to fulfill legal obligations. In any case, they will be kept for the time established by current legislation and/or University regulations regarding the management



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and conservation of documentation produced by the University in the performance of its institutional activity.

Rights of Data Subjects At any time, data subjects may exercise the rights established by Articles 15 et seq. of the GDPR against the Controller:

- access to their personal data and other information indicated in Art. 15 of the GDPR;
- rectification of their personal data if inaccurate and/or their integration where incomplete pursuant to Art. 16 of the GDPR;
- erasure of their personal data except in cases where the University is obliged to retain them pursuant to Art. 17, par. 3 of the GDPR;
- restriction of processing in the scenarios indicated pursuant to Art. 18 of the GDPR;
- objection to the processing of personal data concerning them in cases where this is permitted pursuant to Art. 21 of the GDPR.

To exercise these rights, it is possible to use the specific form found on the "Privacy and Personal Data Protection" page of the University portal and send it to the Controller at the contact details indicated above. Data subjects who believe that the processing of their data takes place in violation of the GDPR have the right, pursuant to Art. 77 of the GDPR, to lodge a complaint with the Data Protection Authority (Garante per la protezione dei dati personali) or to take appropriate judicial action.
